



New traffic patterns may affect your commute to our campus

As early as the night of Thursday, August 8, Oak Hill Parkway crews will perform a major traffic shift involving both eastbound and westbound US 290 throughout a large portion of the project corridor. Please see the attached maps and details below:

New westbound US 290 frontage road opens between Patton Ranch Road (east of William Cannon Drive) and Oak Meadow Drive (west of the ‘Y’ Interchange)

- Westbound US 290 traffic will shift to the north onto the new westbound US 290 frontage road.
- Eastbound US 290 traffic will shift to the north onto new temporary lanes between Oak Meadow Drive and Old Bee Caves Road, then onto the existing westbound US 290 mainlanes between Old Bee Caves Road and Patton Ranch Road.

Old Bee Caves Road access shifts to a Right-In/Right-Out at the westbound US 290 frontage road

- Old Bee Caves Road will become a right-in/right-out permanently at the westbound US 290 frontage road.
- Drivers traveling along eastbound US 290 will make a signalized U-turn at William Cannon Drive for access to Old Bee Caves Road from the new westbound US 290 frontage road.
- Drivers exiting Old Bee Caves Road will continue to use the U-turn in place along SH 71 north of the ‘Y’ Interchange for access to eastbound US 290.
